SPECTACULARITY AND CROWD APPEAL

Spectacularity: Maneuvers performed at a faster pace while not sacrificing precision; music compliments the pace and maneuvers of the drill; manner in which the flags are presented.

Crowd Appeal: Drill presented in a manner pleasing to what would be a totally unbiased audience, not necessarily the crowd on-hand which could be heavily slanted.

GENERAL IMPRESSION

Horses clean and in healthy working condition; equipment and uniforms clean, neat, uniform and in good repair.

PENALTIES (per occurrence)

Broken Tack or Dropped Equipment: Any piece of tack or adornment that requires the team to stop to fix it or any item that falls to the ground. Each item/occurrence is a 5 point penalty.

Fall of Horse or Rider:

Fall as a result of a collision is a 100 point penalty.

Fall not resulting from a collision is a 25 point penalty. Falls resulting from poor arena conditions are at the judge's discretion.

Over/Under Allotted Time Constraints: Time allowed is no less than 4 and no more than 6 minutes. 25 point penalty each minute or fraction thereof over/under the limit.

Drill Time: _____

Re-Group: A drill coach may elect to re-group the team at their discretion.

Re-group is defined as the drill team changing positions while the team has been stopped during their drill. This penalty does not apply to horses/riders which move to mitigate safety issues, re-mount, or during the substitution of a horse/rider as decided by the Show Chairperson. A re-group is a 100 point penalty.

100 x _____

Re-Start: A drill team which has an injury during their drill which necessitates the removal of a rider and/or horse, may elect to re-enter at a later time as approved by the Show Chairperson. They will be assessed a 100 point penalty and their time will not be reset. Only one re-entry is allowed.
